International Course Leaders Qualification

This Qualification will be granted when all the following sections have been fulfilled and the candidate is regarded as an excellent advanced practitioner and an experienced, intuitive and knowledgeable teacher of adults who are training in Sherborne Developmental Movement.

Pre-requisites

- a) The candidate must be a fully paid-up member of the Sherborne Association of his/her nation (or the International Group)
- b) The candidate will have continued to practise Sherborne Developmental Movement at a consistently high standard for at least 18 months since gaining the Advanced Practitioner Certificate
- c) The candidate will have kept a full diary or log of his/her work for the previous 12 months and will have submitted this to his/her mentor for approval prior to the assessed Basic Level 1 Course

Assessment

- 1) The candidate shall organise, prepare, teach and evaluate a one day Basic Level 1 Course in the presence of his/her mentor and internationally-approved assessor. The candidate's manner, sensitivity, enthusiasm, knowledge, observation skills and ability to deal with questions from the adults on the assessed day will be taken into consideration when considering whether s/he is ready to be awarded the ICL Qualification
- 2) The candidate will submit, either before or within 3 months following the assessed day in (1) above, an essay of 3,000 words which describes the main theoretical foundations of Veronica Sherborne's work and discusses how these have influenced the candidate's own approach to his/her Movement work with children or adults.

Award of the Qualification

This will be requested by the Mentor and internationally approved assessor to the International body (ISCO) on successful completion of all the above requirements. A registration fee, renewable every year, is paid

to ISCO who will send the new ICL a registration number and certificate. The new ICL will then have his/her name recorded on the official ISCO web site and in the official ISCO register. S/he is then qualified to run Basic Courses Level 1 and Level 2.

It is very important that the new ICL keeps in touch with his/her national Sherborne organisation and keeps his/her registration and Sherborne membership up to date. If the membership or registration lapses, the ICL will lose his/her status and will need to be assessed again
